Two new local support groups.

Hello everyone. I'm Amelie Lavan and I moved to Warley last summer. When we're allowed to meet, I'd like to offer two support groups to the community. I am a qualified, experienced, group psychotherapist/counsellor. Groups can be powerfully affective and supportive; we experience being with people who really understand our situation. We no longer feel alone and we learn so much from each other.

The first group is a **Therapeutic Carers Group**. It supports carers who are themselves supporting seriously or terminally ill loved ones. We share our experiences and discuss common themes and coping strategies. We find different ways of dealing with what often feels like an impossibly difficult situation.

The second group is a **Bereavement Support Group**. This group offers support to people bereaved by loss of any kind; it could be loss through a relative's Alzheimer's, disability or through death. The loss may be recent or may have been some time ago. We create space to honour and accept our individual experiences and find ways to rebuild our lives.

Unfortunately, due to lockdown restrictions, the starting dates for both groups have been put on hold. However, if you'd like to go on the waiting list for when we can meet again, please get in touch. Hopefully, that's not too far away. There is a small charge for group attendance. History of Warley's pubs

Over the centuries Warley has had several drinking houses or beer houses. The Maypole, originally known as The Horns, is the oldest and dates back to 1650 when it was a farm selling beer just as a sideline. In 1815 The Horns was renamed The Maypole when a pole was erected in the village centre to celebrate peace being declared between France and England.

In 1851, The Abbey Inn, Abbey Lane, Newlands was another old drinking house. The first landlord was called John Hanson. It was rebuilt in 1873 and became a Whittaker pub in 1905. It finally closed in 1911. Over the years it had several landlords. One of them was a William Boocock who left to become the landlord of the Maypole in 1905 where he remained for 6 years. He later passed away In 1916.

The next beer house which opened its doors, in 1861, was the The Winterburn. The name was changed to the Mason's Arms in 1871 after the then landlord James Turner, who was a Stone Mason. More recently it reverted back to being The Winterburn.

Records show that there was another Beer House/Tavern called The Church Tavern which closed in 1869, but I'm afraid I can not find any other information about this so if anyone has any knowledge of this Tavern I would be grateful if you could get in touch.

Church Message from Cote Hill

A number of church members from both St John's Church and St Hilda's Church got together through an on line Zoom computer link on Shrove Tuesday for a pancake party and quiz. Cooking and tossing of pancakes was carried out in individual's homes and a quiz was operated on line from the vicarage. Prizes were awarded and over £300 was raised for The Leprosy Mission which will be match funded by Central Government as part of an Unconditional Leprosy Appeal to support people with Leprosy in need.
