Defibrillators

A defibrillator is a device that gives a high energy shock to the heart through the chest wall to someone who is in cardiac arrest (the heart is not in rhythm but has NOT stopped completely). They are easy to use with simple instructions both on the defibrillator and also once it is switched on the voice will guide you through the instructions for attaching the pads and applying a shock if needed. It will not give a shock if not required and will tell you if you need to continue with CPR.



As you may have noticed, there are currently two publicly-accessible defibrillator cabinets in the village. One of these is outside the Maypole and the other outside the Winterburn. They aren't there simply because it's more likely that someone will need resuscitating when leaving a pub, but because these machines have to be constantly

attached to an electric supply (kindly paid for by the two establishments).

In order to 'complete the set' we are now looking to install a third cabinet which would be at Cote Hill, outside the Peacock winebar. The village and surrounding area to and just beyond the Church will then qualify as a 'Heart Safe Area'. "A Heart Safe Area" is an area where there is access to a Community



Public Access Defibrillator. (CPAD). The focus of our fund-raising this year will be to purchase the third defibrillator. Later we will arrange for a member of the ambulance service to come and give a demonstration - details will be announced in due course.

For the garden....

Memories from 1976

This text is taken from a short article which appeared in the Evening Courier in 1976 called "The village that just fell asleep"

Warley Town was mentioned in the Domesday Book and at one time it was the largest town in the Halifax Borough – complete with its own jail. Some of the older residents do not remember the jail but remember the first bus arriving in 1925. It was box shaped and coloured cream and maroon. Before then Warley residents had to walk to Highroad Well to catch a tram to Halifax as there are not many shops in the village. One older resident remembers a plumbers, and a butchers besides there being a well -equipped general store and post office.

The Vicar of Warley, Rev. Frank Carless arrived here 8 years ago, covering a parish which stretched from Friendly to Mount Tabor. and includes 6,000people. The church has a good attendance with uniform organisations for the young, these included the Scouts, Cubs, Guides and Brownies also there was a youth club and Sunday school. The church also has a men's society, a mother's union, and an over 20's group. Mr Carless said he found the people of Warley to be very friendly and easy.

The Licensee of the Maypole Inn, Mr Jack Wilkinson has also lived in the village for the past 8 years and says he always wanted this pub. He also says "We get all kinds of people in the pub especially tourists in the summer. I think on the whole it is a very close-knit area and certainly not snobby".

The local Councillor Mr George Smith said "Warley is troubled little with vandalism but one of the main problems is rubbish dumpers and litter."

Church Message from Cote Hill

Notwithstanding the continuing – at present – COVID 19 lockdown, some activities on the church plant at Warley St John's are managing to take place.

We have been, and are, holding a 9 30am morning service in the Church, albeit social distanced, once every two weeks (2nd and 4th Sunday as well as when there is a 5th Sunday in the month) as well as the 11 00am online Zoom Joint church service with St Hilda's Church Gibralter Road. Albeit currently only restricted to 6 voices of the church Song Group, some singing has resumed in church services. Singing by all attending church is still curtailed but we are hoping the green light to allow congregational singing isn't too far away – oh how much singing in services in the church building has been, and is, missed!

Later this year the church organ is going to be refurbished and necessary repair work is going to take place funded from a legacy in the name of the Westwood family who formerly were active members of the church for many years. Once the work is completed, organ music will once again be able to be heard in the church alongside other musical instruments now featured in church services and other public events held in church building.

During the week, a Preschool continues to meet daily in and around the church hall and recently 2 mornings a week a mums and toddlers group has re-started meeting in the main body of the church under social distancing rules.

Other church public community meetings are advertised elsewhere in this issue of the Warley Lantern. I hope as many Warley residents as are able will come along to the meeting at St John's Church Hall planned to take place on Monday 26th July at 7 00pm.
